I have been talking to Shawn at the Answering Service about using the website for any meeting information given to the addicts that call our helpline. There will have to be a lot of developing done before this can take place.

I hope to attend all of the Area Service Committees by the end of my first term. Everyone at the

I'd like to welcome everyone to the November 2010 ARSC meeting in Pocahontas home of the "Try Not High" group of Narcotics Anonymous, and gratefully hosted by the Crowley's Ridge Area.

There were three updates to the Regional Guidelines and P&P manuals:

- ☎ Guidelines – page 2 – under **Tradition Two (First 2 Paragraphs)** - added to 1st paragraph – 2nd sentence: *Our 2nd Tradition is an example of this.*

This was an omission that was pointed out to me at the last RSC. I added the sentence to make the paragraph in our Guidelines consistent with the paragraph in the Basic Text.

- ☎ Policy & Procedure – page 17 – under **Election of Trusted Servants** – number 1) now reads: *Nominations for the RD and RD Alternate will be opened at the May meeting of ARSC every other year (even years). Nominations will then be closed at the August RSC meeting and referred to the Areas/Loner Groups. Elections will be held at the November RSC meeting. Nominees' names and qualifications will be included in the August ARSC minutes.*

As per Motion MO3080810 passed at the last RSC.

- ④ Policy & Procedure – page 17 – under **Election of Trusted Servants** – number 2) - added:
Nominees' names and qualifications will be included in the May ARSC minutes.
As per direction from the RSC body.

I will be forwarding a motion to the body in new business to propose a change to the Policy & Procedures section under **Office Vacancies** – number 6) which currently reads: *If less than six months is remaining in a newly-elected RSC Trusted Servant or standing Subcommittee Chair's term, this will not be considered a full term of office.* To the best of my recollection, this has not been our practice. We have counted any term less than one year as interim and did not count it against the two consecutive term limits alluded to in number 8 under **Election of Trusted Servants.**

I have updated the distribution and revision tracking sheet and will be updating the available manuals that are here during the RSC meeting this weekend. I also have manuals for those trusted servants who were unable to get them from their predecessors. Please let me know if you need one.

The budget total is probably good for the upcoming year. The only difference I would recommend would be in eliminating the travel portion and increasing the copies and portfolios line.

Since the last time that the ARSCNA has met, I have had two opportunities to do some work on two projects. The first opportunity was in Mountain Home. There is a health fair held in Mountain Home annually. It is usually held at the fairgrounds but this year they changed the venue to The Hope Center at TLBC in Mountain Home. The booth space is usually cost prohibitive to be able to participate. Since the venue was changed, I asked a contact person if we could set up a table this year, if it would be affordable. I was told that I could set up a table at no cost. I set up a small table with our PR Literature Rack and meeting lists. The Ozark Area also contacted me. From *the Answering Service* information will be relayed to the Outreach Chairperson and the Website Chairperson *on the 10th of the month prior to the RSC meetings. (January 10, April 10, July 10 and October 10)*

OUTREACH

Basic Purpose:

The Arkansas Regional Outreach Committee shall be one point of contact between the Region and the answering service and shall be responsible for maintaining accurate meeting lists to prevent distribution of inaccurate information to addicts within, as well as visitors to, the Arkansas Region. To serve the needs of all Areas within the Arkansas Region by coordinating Area Outreach sub-committees and conducting services that develops and strengthens Outreach efforts within the Region and the Fellowship.

Function of the Subcommittee:

- 1) Produces a Regional Meeting List to be updated quarterly. The meeting list is to be printed four (4) times per year (in February, August, May, & November). See "Meeting List Criteria".
- 2) Provides Area Outreach subcommittees an opportunity to share their experience, strength, and hope.
- 3) Conducts workshops/learning days to address and/or work on problems the member Areas/Loner Groups are experiencing or to discuss new methods of Outreach work.
- 4) Develop and maintain an Outreach Handbook and other resources and materials necessary to better carry the message.
- 5) Coordinates with other Regional subcommittees on matters related to Outreach.
- 6) Maintains communication with World Services. Communication flows both ways between the Area and World level through the regional subcommittee.
- 7) Maintains communication with Fellowship Services and the NAWS database as needed.
- 8) Maintains Regional Map showing constituent Area Groups, H&I Presentations, and Loner Groups.
- 9) *Maintain* five (5) Arkansas Regional Service Committee "New Group Starter Kits," *making new order quarterly, but never letting inventory reduce below 2 kits.* These kits will contain those NA approved materials needed for any newly started Group to start off with accurate information concerning NA service structure and the NA program in general. A treasury request for funding/budget will be required.

10) *Maintain* five (5) Group Readings to send to those groups who request them for their meetings. *Making new order quarterly, but never letting inventory reduce below 2 sets.*

Meeting List Criteria

1. Use Area meeting lists as available.
2. For a Group not covered by an Area meeting list, there would be two requirements to be on Regional Meeting List:
 - a. Group must have 90 days in existence.
 - b. Group must be attempting to adhere to the Twelve Traditions.

Regional Meeting Lists should include the following items:

1. Area-Group Phonenumber numbers
 2. Day and Time
 3. Smoking or Non-Smoking
 4. Handicap accessibility
 5. Meeting type - Open or Closed
 6. Meeting format - Topic, discussion, speaker, etc.
 7. Meeting attended by predominately (men, women, etc.) when pertinent.
- Regional Meeting List to be updated every three months. RCMs are responsible for getting up-to-date information to Outreach Chair.

PHONELINE

Specific Purpose:

The Arkansas Regional Phonenumber Committee shall be *one* point of contact between the Region and the answering service and shall be responsible for maintaining (accurate meeting lists and) contact numbers to prevent distribution of inaccurate information to addicts within, as well as visitors to, the Arkansas Region.

Functions and Responsibilities:

- A. Operate and maintain the Arkansas Regional Phonenumber provided by a professional answering service. This committee shall function utilizing NA conference-approved suggestions as put forth in "A Guide To Phonenumber Service."
- B. Develop and maintain an instructional package of procedures, policies and guidelines for phonenumber operation by the answering service. Conduct periodic presentations for orientation of answering service personnel.
- C. Maintain a roster of contacts of Regional Administrative and Standing Committee Trusted Servants, which shall include committee position held, first name with last initial, and phone number(s). Keep the answering service informed as changes occur.
- D. Maintain communication with the answering service and any pertinent NA World Services contacts to ensure availability of the most current information.
- E. Develop and maintain a Phonenumber Orientation Package for the use of phonenumber volunteers. Provide training, such as group and individual orientations, for such volunteers.
- F. Provide a forum or pooling place for Area Phonenumber Subcommittees to share their experience, strength and hope.
- G. Conduct flyer days, learning days, and activities that will attract and keep phonenumber volunteers.
- (H. Provide to the Regional Outreach Committee no less than two weeks prior to publication of the Regional Meeting List, a current list of all additions, deletions, and/or changes as reported by the answering service.)

Website purpose shall be determined as defined in the *Policy and Procedures manual*.

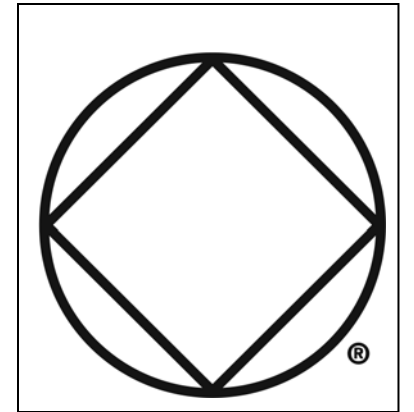

Description of the Southern Zonal Forum

NA is a nonprofit fellowship or society of men and women for whom drugs had become a major problem. If you are new to our program please come to a meeting and see us. Narcotics Anonymous is a program that works. We help each other stay off of drugs and become productive members of society again. After coming to NA we realized we were sick people. We suffered from a disease from which there is no known cure. It can, however, be arrested at some point, and recovery is then possible.

We are located in the southern-central part of the United States. The geographical area of the Southern Zonal Forum extends from Richlands, Virginia west over 1446 miles (2327 Kilometers) to Del Rio, Texas and from Brownsville, Texas to the northern border of Missouri, which is 1300 miles (2090 kilometers). This covers over 900,000 square miles (1,500,000 square kilometers).

We meet quarterly in one of our member regions to discuss topics that affect Narcotics Anonymous as a whole. We believe that by sharing our experience, strength and hope in the service area, we can better fulfill our primary purpose. We are not a decision making body, we are solution based discussion forum dealing with topics from groups, areas and regions.

Decision Making and Participation

The process that the Southern Zonal Forum (SZF) uses to invite a loving Higher Power into our decision making process is consensus based rather than voting. This allows for consideration of all viewpoints.

Ideas may be presented for consideration. Clarity on issues for which we would like to collect a group conscience allow for discussion. Discussion will then be heard and the facilitator may ask if we have reached an agreement. The minority opinion should always be heard and considered by all participants. Where we are not in agreement, further discussion may then be necessary.

At each SZF, we maintain a reference guide of all past actions by SZF members. These may be referred to, or reconsidered at any SZF.

The Southern Zonal Forum welcomes all addicts and is primarily comprised of RD's (Regional Delegates) and their alternates, regional trusted servants, and other interested members (such

as home group members, GSR's and ASC members) from each participating Region within the Southern Zone. The viewpoints of these members should always be sought and carefully considered due to the fact that they represent the Fellowship in general within the SZF. Also, any NA members attending a SZF has equal participation privileges and should be encouraged to be a part of our conscience-based decisions.

Through an open exchange of ideas and experience and inviting our Higher Power in our decision making process, the SZF is able to function in a manner that will allow us to schedule future events and not detract from our initial purpose. As we evolve, we know our Higher Power will continue to guide us in our goal to be a valuable asset and resource to our member Regions, and the addict yet to come.

- 11th Concept – NA funds are to be used to further our primary purpose, and must be managed responsibly.

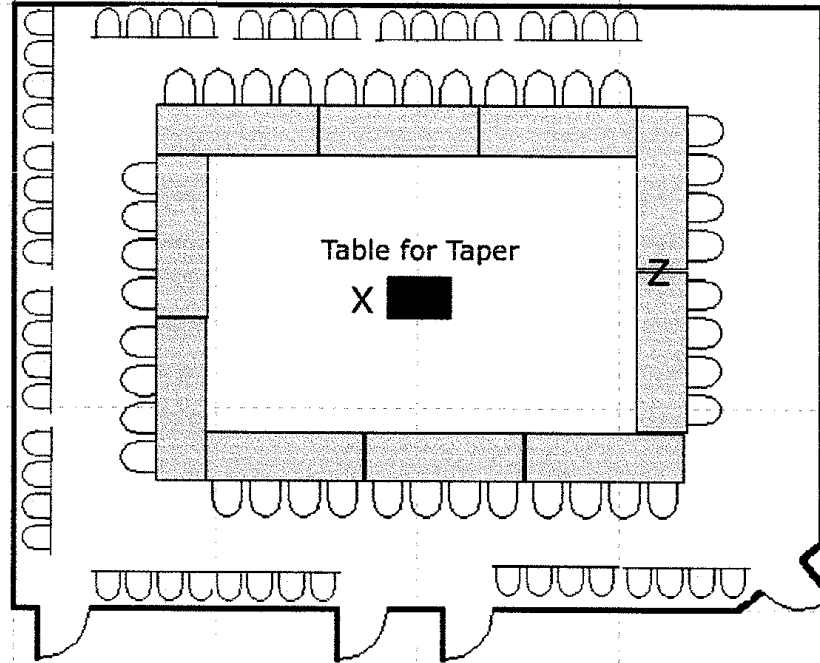
SZF Hosting Organizer

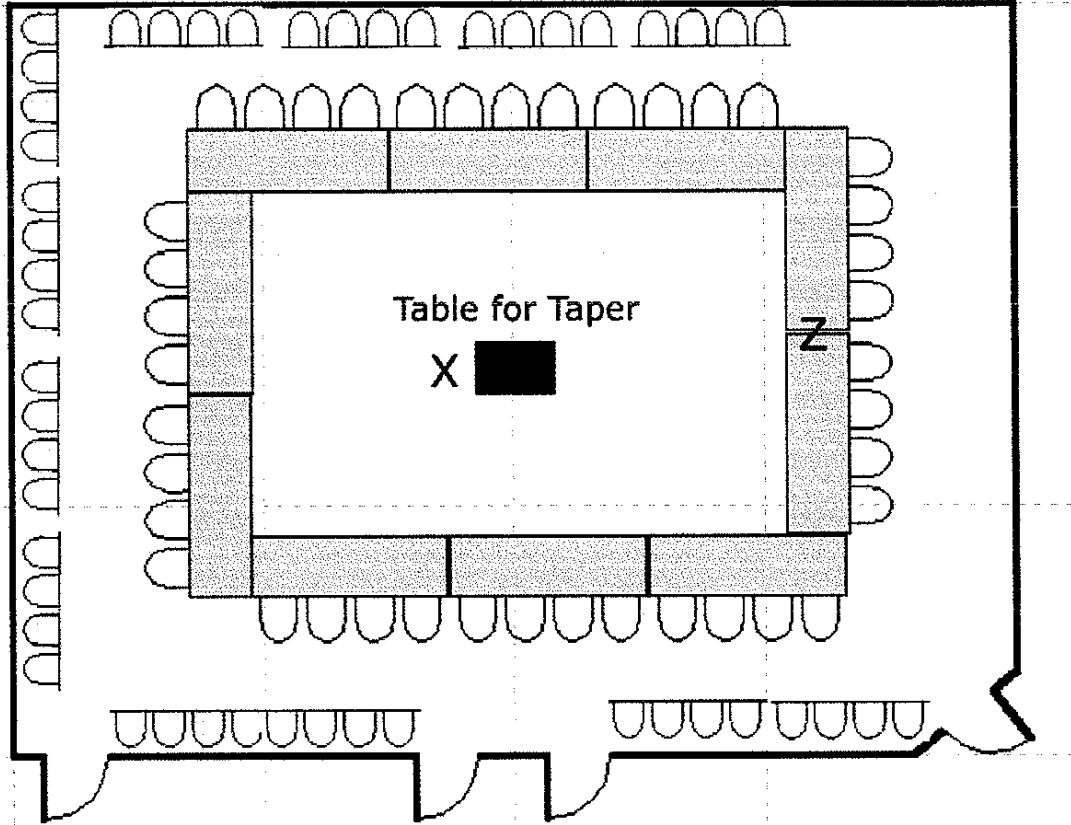

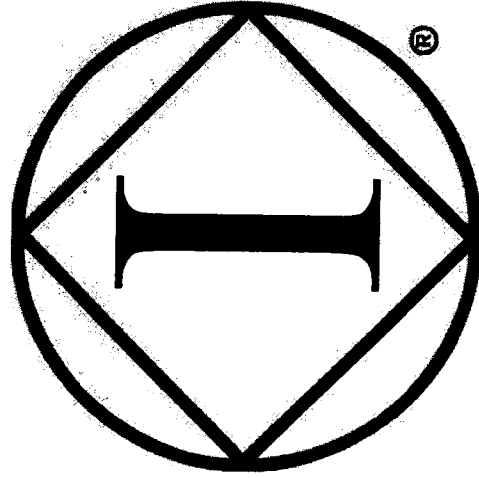

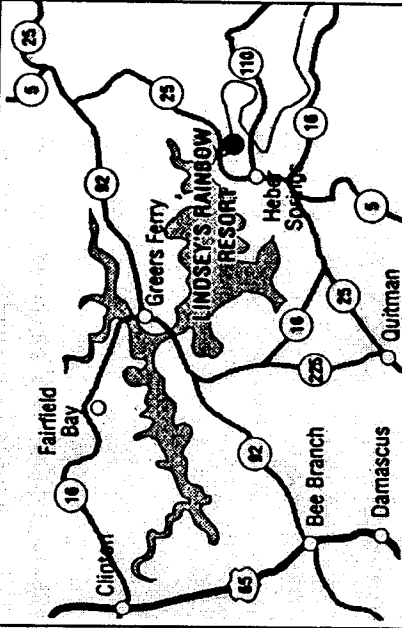
