Fellowship Concerns

Luke (MS): Some concerns have been voiced at the RSC by myself and some of the other RCM's. The Region is looking for purpose; people seem to be doing minimal to nothing while holding their positions. Hoping to do more information gathering and we are looking forward to hosting the next SZF.

Dianna (AR): Couple or areas are struggling to stay together and trying to work with them to continue to be a part of the region.

Rodney (LA): Still trying to overcome struggle in the New Orleans Areas. The idea of combining two areas is still on the table but seems challenged to make it happen.

Krusten (MO): 18 areas strong with two struggling rural. There are some entries at the Participant Board on incorporation. We have been looking for a strong PR committee to umbrella a mixture of services under to help ease monetary issues.

Dawn (TB): Convention in San Marcus coming up, going to hold some CAR workshops right at the convention. Incorporate the discussion topics right into the program. Made note of the "texting in meetings" phenomenon that is cropping up around the fellowship.

Pete (TN): Have some motions at the Region to get the fund flow defined. The funding towards the SZF is ok'd and should be received soon.

Mike (KY): Lost an area. The members of the Region have taken to more discussions and less motioning. Consensus Based Decision Making is being brought up as a possibility. We have a Convention, Easter weekend, coming up in Louisville.

Tim (LS): Members with time, whose missing at our meetings.

Kaye (LS): Tyler TX hope group (4th year now) – lack of clean time to sponsor. A lot of paper signing, meetings growing from court appointed but sparse on the old-timers.

At this time PR chair requested to give his report since there were some area PR chairs in attendance today.

PUBLIC RELATIONS

Greetings Family,

Thanks Central for hosting this weekend. The *Guide to Local Services (GTLs)* describes a regional subcommittee as "regional-level subcommittees composed of chairpersons of corresponding area-level subcommittees gather to share experience and information in their particular fields of service". This suggests that Area chairpersons show up to regional meetings to discuss what is going on in their respective Areas. I would like to thank everyone for attending, with special thanks for the Area Chairpersons & Vice-Chairpersons that attended today.

We first heard from the Ozark Area. They talked about getting ready to start working with flyers in their area. They had some initial dealings with the Boone County Jail, but the individual that did that is no longer involved so they need to re-open lines of communication. We talked about their chairperson and the area RCM going to do a presentation and I offered to assist if we can come up with a time when I can. We talked about getting together and going over some things before going in. The Ozark Area has placed a literature rack at the VA in Harrison.

We then heard from Central Arkansas Area. A main priority is making sure the meetings listed on the meeting lists have all the current and correct information. They all also are working on making sure that local periodicals have all the correct meeting information. We discussed that *Mid South Summer School* will be happening in June. The Arkansas Region has assisted in this endeavor for several years. We provide Regional Meeting Lists for them to disperse at their booth. We discussed what we needed, and we will be providing them with 500 meeting lists at the May ARSCNA. Central Arkansas has switched over to the smaller sized literature racks as a way of being able to carry the message effectively to schools, probation offices, and other appropriate places that might be in need of literature. Central Arkansas also makes sure to keep these racks restocked as needed. The Area RCM stated that he had the old copy of the *PI Handbook*. I told him I would get him a copy of the *PR (Public Relations) Handbook*. The Area RCM has requested a workshop in the future for the Central Arkansas Area.

Foothills Unity Area talked about recently completing a presentation to nursing students at Harding University. They also discussed trying to get into ASU in Beebe. We talked a little about how to approach groups of people that are not initially receptive to NA.

Earlier in the day, during the *CAR* workshop, we discussed the project plans in the Conference *Approval Track* materials. One of these project plans up for discussion and approval is the project plan for *Public Relations*. Following is that project plan.

Public Relations

Purpose and scope:

NA World Services has continued to further public relations (PR) activity undertaken directly by NAWS which includes attending professional events and meetings such as Recovery Month and National Drug Court Institute, and facilitating PR workshops in various NA communities; as well as participating in cooperative events coordinated by NAWS but carried out by local NA communities. This is covered in two places in the NAWS budget: in Literature Production and Distribution in the line item for marketing and in Fellowship Development in the line item for professional events.

Additionally in this conference cycle, we plan to begin the work of training and orienting both addict and non-addict professionals to better address our needs in PR. We have known for some time that we need to build a broad and trained resource pool for use in a variety of public relations settings. This project was presented and approved at WSC 2008, but we were unable to initiate this needed work due to limited resources. These same focused trainings or roundtables would be used to gather information for the development of material targeted for specific professional populations for PR purposes. This material would be World Board approved. We also expect to have PR Basics, a service tool identified with the approval of the *Public Relations Handbook*, and a revised version of H&I Basics completed before WSC 2010. We hope to create additional short resource pieces based on material already covered in other approved service material like the *PR Handbook* and Area Planning Tool.

The objectives, outcomes, and approaches which led to this project plan are:

OBJECTIVE 3: Develop cooperative relationships throughout the service system with addiction professionals, researchers, and others to enhance perception of NA as a credible program of recovery.

Outcomes: By 2012 . . .

3.1 Cooperative relationships are being established and/or strengthened with professionals (in

particular medical and researchers).

3.2 Targeted literature is developed for professional audiences based on results of roundtables.

3.3 Groundwork has been laid for outreach throughout service system.

Existing Approaches to be carried over into 2010-2012

Continue work on PR tools.

Attendance at professional events and coordination of cooperative events.

Plan and conduct professional roundtables, particularly with members who are also professionals.

Conduct training for those who can speak on our behalf. This may lead to development of pamphlets geared to specific professional populations – treatment, medical, correctional, etc. (see below for priority focus).

Evaluation of current strategies, with attendance at professional events, and building relationships and refocus for the cycle.

Develop a focus and strategy for building relationships with governments.

Improve relationships with related fellowships like Nar-Anon and AA.

New Approaches for 2010-2012

(D) Conduct professional roundtables with medical and research professionals.

Proposed 2010–2012 Project Plans 41

(E) Two-pronged approach: 1) Model for members how to develop a PR strategy and plan, making better use of experienced people in local communities, and 2) offer train-the trainer sessions on using PR tools to implement the overall PR strategy and plan.

OBJECTIVE 6: Provide clear guidance and support on philosophical issues that challenge NA groups.

Outcomes: By 2012 . . .

6.1 Local leaders have the tools to address several complex issues currently facing the fellowship (e.g., drug courts and drug replacement).

New Approaches for 2010-2012

(K) Collect best practices regarding how to respond to drug courts. Develop tools and discussions with the service system, and separately for the groups, to help them better deal with this issue.

6–8 Training and Orientation Sessions

UPDATED TREASURER'S REPORT

Hi Family,

Here is the final report for his regional meeting. We took in \$3,427.84 since our last meeting in November of 2009. Not only were able to pay all of our bills, we were also able to send another donation to the Southern Zonal Forum in the amount of \$56.42 and to Narcotics Anonymous World Services in the amount of \$507.84.

We made two changes to our annual budget. Matt F requested an increase to the H&I budget from \$60.00 annually to \$400.00 annually to account for travel to do workshops and Bill La decreased the Public Relations budget from \$1000.00 to \$600.00. This ends up saving us \$60.00 annually and our prudent reserve changes from \$2618.60 to 2603.60.

I went through the treasury checkbook and ledger to insure that everything had been returned. It had and was in good condition with two minor concerns. In November Bill Le (our chairperson) and Pat went to Northwest Arkansas to attend a business meeting. At that time they were given a \$500.00 donation from Northwest Arkansas. We will get that slip from him at the next meeting and the money has been accounted for in the ledger. The other concern is a check that was written to Pat P. in November for SZF travel. Pat was unable to attend the forum and believes the check was destroyed in the wash. We are waiting for bank statements from November through January to verify that the check wasn't cashed and then the amount of \$374.80 will be added back in to the account.

At the end of this meeting all of the treasury items including the archives have been turned over to the care of our vice-chair person, Matt. This includes all of the blank checks and the checkbook with ledger. Pam will forward all treasury related mail to Matt and as soon as we receive the bank statements Matt and I will go through the ledgers. The ARSCNA will perform an audit of the account at the next regional meeting since it is changing hands.
